Minutes of the planning meeting held on Monday 1st August 2022

1. Acceptance of apologies for absence

Apologies were received from Andrew Ramsay, John Coldwell and Roland van Wilk and the reason for absence accepted.

6. New Model Code of Conduct 'Other Registrable Interests' forms.

7. Email from West Suffolk Council about street lighting.

Lackford Parish Council has received the following email from West Suffolk Council:

West Suffolk Council and Suffolk County Council are carrying out an audit of street lighting in the district, including all parish and town council lighting.

According to information provided by Suffolk County Council, many parish and town councils own and maintain lights across West Suffolk. However, many of these lights are not yet upgraded to LED lanterns, meaning that the environmental and cost benefits are yet to be realised.

The purpose of the audit is to update our understanding of streetlight distribution, type, and purpose across the area, while engaging relevant parish and town councils to see if they are willing to work with West Suffolk and Suffolk County Council further on this issue.

At the moment, based on the information provided by Suffolk County Council, data suggests that your council does not own any lights.

In addition, we'd also be interested to hear your opinion on any West Suffolk Council or Suffolk County Council lighting in your area:

Are there any lights that no longer serve their original intended purpose, or are otherwise surplus to requirements?

Would your council be interested in installing and maintaining any additional lights of its own to supplement those owned by SCC and WSC? If so, then please state where and why.

Red - strategic lorry routes. All movements crossing Suffolk should use these, with those starting or ending in the county using them in preference to local lorry routes.

Blue - zone distribution lorry routes - roads within a zone serving as a route to a local access route.

Green - local access routes - roads or parts of roads serving as access to a specific location.

Yellow - local access routes with restrictions.

Grey - lorry watch areas.
