November Awareness Campaign: ASB Awareness Week



ASB Awareness Week 2024 runs from 18th - 24th November.

During the week, Resolve is holding a series of <u>5 webinars</u> relating to some of the daily themes from ASB Awareness Week. All webinars are completely free to attend and will feature a selection of sector-leading experts. <u>Registration required</u>.

Everybody has a right to feel safe where they live, and we all have a part to play. Resolve's mission is to "Make Communities Safer".

Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) can have serious impact on some people, and therefore it is important that people can learn about how to recognise and report ASB.

Data shows that over half of victims and witnesses don't report anti-social behaviour. Some of the reasons cited for not reporting include "Didn't think it was serious enough", "Didn't know how/where to make a report", "Didn't think anything would be done if I did make a report", "Made a report before and was unsatisfied with the response".

Despite this, it is crucial that we all report ASB when we see it, as ASB can be a precursor to serious crime and through people reporting incidents, this could initiate an intervention, help that person to get support if they need it, and prevent escalation towards a serious harmful incident.

Neighbourhood Watch Network: Volunteer Opportunities

BT Digital Voice switchover

Volunteering opportunities Neighbourhood Watch are looking for volunteers to deliver one or more awareness events in Suffolk to provide essential information around the BT Digital Voice switchover that will be happening by end of January 2027.



This will impact anyone that has a BT analogue landline but in particular the elderly, vulnerable, remote/isolated and those with little or no mobile signal/broadband connection.

Volunteers can choose to do one or more events. Two training sessions will be provided over MS Teams by BT and Neighbourhood Watch and volunteers would not be expected to have technical expertise or knowledge. Resources will be provided to support conversations.



A number of events will take place across Suffolk in preparation for the switchover. As Venus and dates are confirmed they will appear on our website at https://suffolknwa.co.uk/bt-digital-voice.html where you can also find more details about this volunteering opportunity.

Crimestoppers: Pension Scams

100% anonymous. Always.

3 ways to protect yourself

1. Unsolicited advice

if you get a 'cold call' or call out of the blue about your pension, the best and safest thing to do is hang up. It is illegal and most likely a fraudster. If you get offers via email or text, these should be ignored also. Action Fraud, the National Fraud & Cyber Crime Reporting Centre, is reminding people that if they have been contacted out of the blue about their pension, it is probably a scam.

2. Get advice first

If you're considering changing your pension arrangements, you should get financial advice first. If you want to find an adviser, make sure they're authorised by the <u>Financial Conduct Authority</u> NEVER take advice from the company that contacted you, it could be part of the scam.

3. Investment opportunities

Don't be rushed into making an investment. Remember, if an organisation was legitimate, they would never pressure you into investing on the spot.

To find out about scams across Suffolk, <u>you can sign up to the Trading Standards email alert</u> on their website. Trading Standards can investigate and take court action against scammers.










Scheme Coordinators: Registering your scheme on the national database



if you haven't already done so, we highly recommend all our scheme coordinators and their members to register individually on the national Neighbourhood Watch Network website.

We will continue to process the mapping of all schemes registered with the Suffolk Neighbourhood Watch Association (SNWA) onto the National NW database. This enables the public to search for Neighbourhood Watch schemes on the national website as well as our own website.

Whilst not mandatory, we do encourage Scheme Coordinators registered with us to also register on the national database, which will enable them to "claim" their scheme on the national system.

Scheme Coordinators registered on the national database are approved and validated by the Suffolk Neighbourhood Watch Association.

Once registered, scheme coordinators can invite existing and future neighbours to join their scheme online, and use the built in ALERT message system as a method of engaging with their scheme members.

Benefits of registering

Scheme coordinators and members can expect to receive a monthly newsletters from both the national organisation, as well as the Suffolk Association. Members can also access a range of training workshops, seminar sessions, and varying forums offered by the national organisation.

When signing up, members can also opt in to receive a range of alert messages from services such as Action Fraud, Get Safe Online, Trading Standards etc.
